We have a vision that all young people realize their full potential. Right now is a critical time to focus on children's health and wellbeing, and their futures. We must protect them from the added adversities and stresses that came with the pandemic we are faced with, including loneliness and social isolation. We believe that the number one tool in battling prolonged adversity in young people is to provide additional developmental relationships. When young people have positive, reliable, caring mentors in their lives, they are more likely to be engaged in school and at home, have better social competence and mental health, and grow up to be positive contributors to society.

Every year our Organization provides service to hundreds of children and youth through our one-one and group mentoring programs in our communities and in schools, and provides direct funding support to the families that we work with. Our steps to providing these crucial services include recruiting and screening volunteers, training volunteers to understand developmental relationships, matching volunteers with young people facing adversity, and supporting that match so that our young people realize a positive impact from the mentoring relationship. There is no cost for families to participate in any Big Brothers Big Sisters program, nor is there a cost to volunteer. We believe in providing barrier-free opportunities for Children & Youth to strive through mentorship.

Right now we have young people waiting for a mentor and we are more committed to our communities than ever. We are actively moving forward with building our inclusive, safe green space that will be used by Bigs and Littles matches for decades to come, will continue to grow our dairy bar social enterprise employing youth, and most importantly, will continue to work to ensure that local children and youth that could benefit from an additional mentoring relationship, have one. 

Our Solution

Many children and youth in Colchester struggle with societal barriers and face adversities in their lives like detrimental living conditions, family violence, risk factors for mental health, school issues, and identity challenges.

These circumstances have nothing to do with the value of who they are or who they can become, but because of these situations, children and youth risk not having the opportunity to live up to their full potential.

Even worse is the possibility of continuing cycles of poverty and crime or developing mental health issues. This comes at a cost to the young person, and to society. With the guidance and support of a mentor, these risks can be reduced or even avoided, and youth are reminded they can be anything they dream of being. We provide direct service to children by matching volunteers and youth in quality mentoring relationships. Our agency staff members are experts at screening volunteers and matching them with a mentee having similar interests.

Building for Tomorrow Project

A Community Program: Portapique, Nova Scotia

In April of 2020, our community suffered a heartbreaking tragedy. The senseless and tragic loss of 23 lives. Already in the midst of a Global Pandemic, our community had to come together to support one another. With the Support from an initiative of a Big Brother in Halifax we donated \$5000 to the Portapique "Community Build Up" Project, but we knew the best way to support the community was to offer programming to the youth residing there. We created the "Building For Tomorrow Project". A program focused on community connection and the three themes below:

Our COVID Response

When COVID hit we adapted to ensure the safety and well-being of our Littles and volunteers, while supporting each match to make sure they had the proper skills and tools to stay connected.

Mentoring Matters Fund- \$4000 Back to our Families


The success of our fundraisers allow us to genoursly support our Littles and their families when they are in need. To highlight a few:

Match Outting Support- \$1700 back to our matches to connect and share new experiences together

We provided a \$75 reimbursement per match for the holidays. Bigs used this for special Christmas gifts for their Littles, as well as holiday activities.

Bigs used the regular reimbursement for board games, craft supplies, and for taking their Littles for special meals.

Pandemic Support for Basic Needs

We were able to donate a portion of our Big Bucks 50/50 draw to provide families \$100 per child in April of 2020 for a total of **\$12,100** to our families, at the height of pandemic isolation.

These funds were used for things like groceries, household bills, purchasing activities for kids to do at home that might not typically be in the budget.

Holiday Support

We provided each child in our program with a gift card for \$50, for a total of **\$4800** given to families during the holidays.

We partnered with **Red Woof Inn Doggie Daycare** once again this year. They contributed to 25 of our families.

Vimy Court supported 4 of our families, providing toys, clothing and meals.







